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					<p>As required by Massachusetts General Law (CMR 963 2:10), all School District applicants who have been invited to participate in the MSBA eligibility module are required to “form a School Building Committee for the purpose of generally monitoring the Application process and to advise the Eligible Applicant during the construction of an approved project.” The MSBA must approve the School Building Committee and update the Authority of any changes to the committee. In addition, the District must make every effort to ensure continuity of membership for the School Building Committee throughout the life of an approved project. The School Planning Committee shall be responsible for recommend sites for new facilities, determine school program requirements, select an architect, to work with the architect to develop building plans through Design Development and to prepare articles and presentations for Town Meeting and the general public in support of school building projects.</p> <p>For purposes of the MSBA requirements, the School Planning Committee meets all the membership requirements of both the MSBA School Building Committee and the Town Meeting School Planning Committee.</p>
